For full time M.Phil. Scholars: Rs. 3000/- to Rs. 5000/- Per Month

### Information Resource Centre (IRC) shows remarkable progress

The Central Library of the University located at TAB, Shahpur Campus, provides access to both print and electronic information resources. The library has a total collection of 4725 books mainly in the subject areas of Management Sciences, Economics, Social Work, Information Technology, Mathematics, Library Information Science, and English Language and Literature, Tourism Management, Environment Studies,

Journalism and New Media, besides general reference collections.

The books are classified and organized according to the Dewey Decimal Scheme of Classification (21<sup>st</sup> Ed.) and online public access catalogue of the library is under the process of development.

The library subscribes and receives about fifty three print Journals and Magazines which are displayed in the periodical section. This subscription list is being enormously expanded as requests are coming from various departments. The library subscribes to six national, regional and local newspapers. The library is providing online access to select e-journals, e-books and databases made available under the UGC-Infonet Consortium of Electronic Journals and Databases by Inflibnet, Ahmedabad.

# **TAB** to procure 100 Computers and Printers

The Deansø Council constituted a two-member Committee for the procurement of computers and printers for various Schools & Departments in the University. Dr. Rabindranath Manukonda, Dean, School of Journalism & Creative Writing and Dr. OSKS Sastri, Dean, School of Physical & Material

Sciences, as members of the committee, identified the need for computers and printing facilities for various Schools in the university. They also successfully acquired the rates for the equipment from various vendors as per the DGS&D prescribed government rates. The recommendations of the Committee

have been forwarded for consideration and approval by the Deansø Council. The university hopes to acquire the recommended 100 desktop computers and 100 printers within the next two months. This will facilitate the teaching-learning process to progress in a more effective manner.

an extent of eighty percent and the final packaging of the product is still in progress and is expected to soon take final shape.

# **Block Placement Training of MSW Students**

Block Placement Training is an integral part of the MSW Programme and is mandatory for all students in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester. The purpose of Block Placement is to provide students preemployment experience and training. It helps broaden the students' perspective and also enables them to assume professional responsibilities after completing the degree. Fifteen students of MSW were placed

in various development agencies for a period of 45 days (between July & August). Students are placed in diverse agency settings viz. hospitals, NGOs, govt. agencies, counseling centers, welfare organizations and industries. On completion of training students submit a detailed report of the work done and learning opportunities received. Organisation in which MSW students were

placed are: Government Zonal Hospital, Dharamshala; National Institute of Public Corporation & Child Development (NIPCCD) Delhi; DRDA, Shimla & Dharamahala; Vardhman Group of Companies, Ludhiana; NHPC, Chamba, H.P.; National Rural Health Mission (NRHM), Shimla; Centre for Sustainable Development, Mandi; Garib Nawaz Society, New Delhi.



### **Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP)**



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Committed to Inclusive Access and Excellence in Higher Education



Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP) was established under the Central Universities Act 2009 enacted by the Parliament of India. The University became functional from 20th January 2010 with Professor Furqan Qamar assuming the charge as the first and founder Vice Chancellor of the University

Standing for Inclusive Access and Excellence in Higher Education, it is a multidisciplinary university. The Vision document of the University provides for seventeen different schools with five to six Departments and two to three Centres in each school. Of these eleven Schools and eighteen Departments and two Centres have been made functional

The University has adopted comprehensive choice based credit system which mandates students to accumulate at least 30 percent credits from departments other than those in which they major. This makes all programmes of studies inter-disciplinary and all students study in an interdisciplinary environment. All programmes of studies are based on semester system and the University follows comprehensive continuous internal assessment and Grading System

The University is to have its headquarter in Dharamshala and two distinct campuses located in Dharamshala and Dehra, both in the picturesque Kangra District of Himachal Pradesh. The land for both the campuses have been identified and allotted to the University and proposal for FCA clearance is at the advanced stages of progress. Following which, the land is likely to be transferred to the University and construction of permanent campuses shall begin.

In the Interim, the university has commenced its academic activities from the Temporary Academic Block (TAB) located at Shahpur in the Kangra District. The Headquarter of the University is located at Camp Office at Dharamshala.
