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
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Dear Readers,

First Meeting of the University Court Held

First meeting of the first Court of the Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP) was held under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chancellor Shri Arun Maira on 7th December 2012 in the Conference Hall of the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi. The meeting was attended by 19 out of the 27 members that constitute the first Court of the University. Highest authority of the University under the Central Universities Act 2009, the first Court is chaired by the Chancel-

lor and has 25 members. Registrar of the University is the exofficio Member Secretary of the Court. The University Court is vested with the power and functions to review from time to time the broad policies and programmes of the University and to suggest measures for the improvement and development of the University; to consider and pass resolutions on the annual report and the annual accounts of the University and the audit report on such accounts; to advise the Visitor in respect of any matter which may be referred to it for advice; and to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

He stated that he was happy to know that a composition of the Court is such that it consists of eminent educationists, academicians, senior bureaucrats and personalities from all walks of life. hoped that the University shall immensely benefit from their rich experiences in the field of higher education. The Chancellor thereafter requested the Vice -Chancellor to briefly apprise all the members about the composition, powers and functions of the Court, and also to make a presentation on the progress made by the University so far.

The Vice-Chancellor made a comprehensive presentation giving the composition, powers and functions of the Court, the development that the university could achieve since its

establishment and the academic programmes that were launched and being run by the University.

In his presentation, the Vice Chancellor high-lighted the innovative academic architecture, curricular framework, profile of the faculty and enrolment indicated the remarkable progress that the University has made in a short period of time.

He also mentioned that the University is presently operating from its temporary facilities as the land identified for the campuses of the University has not been transferred to it for want of FCA clearance and that the matter is presently under consideration of the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Government of India.

Distinguished members appreciated the efforts made by the University with regard to academic activities, resource mobilisation and infrastructure development and complemented the Vice Chancellor and his team and faculty for making rapid strides with focussed attention and in bound time manner. Hon'ble members held

detailed deliberations about the vision and strategic plan of the University and were highly impressed with the innovative academic architecture and curricular framework developed and implemented by the University. Members expressed their appreciation for the efforts made by the University in attracting quality faculty from all over India and with due regard to the reservation policy. Distinguished members assured that they would like to play a proactive role and shall help and advise the University in its efforts to become a premier higher educational institution of the country.

The Teacher in Prof. Furgan Qamar

The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Furgan Qamar apart from being a visionary and a deft administrator, who has charted the University in a fast-paced growth path is also a renowned academician and teacher par excellence. Very few persons in such key positions ever find time to address the students in the classroom delivering lectures based on the regular course curriculum.

The Ph.D. Research Scholars of the University cutting across various Schools & Departments were in for a pleasant surprise. As part of their Course Work, the second batch of research scholars of CUHP were undergoing a course in Quantitative Research Methods. Prof. Furgan Qamar had a task cut for himself. An expert in the use of MS Excel & SPSS in his own right, Prof. Qamar started with some of the basics of research and methodology issues. He then shifted to the manner in which data is entered in Excel Sheets for the creation of databases, preparation of tables using pivot tables and using these tables for data analysis, univariate & multi-variate analysis of data and their interpretation. Lecture and demonstration methods were used.

The Dean & Head, School of Education, Dr. Arbind Jha, who had arranged for these special sessions for the Ph.D. research scholars. introduced Furqan Qamar to students on the first day with the able support of Dr. Manoj Saxena, Associate Professor, Department of Education.

The participating students enjoyed the sessions of their Vice-Chancellor who they felt was very articulate in clarifying all the concepts involved. They all felt that they would savour these moments for a long time to come. This workshop was held on 3-4 Dec. 2012.

Workshop on Documentary Film Making

A four-day workshop on "Understanding Visual Images and Documentary Film Making" was conducted by Prof. K.P. Jayasankar, Chairperson, Centre for Critical Media Praxis from Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai at School of Journalism, Mass Communication and New Media, CUHP from 30th Oct. to 2nd Nov. 2012.

The workshop provided hands on training to the students of New Media Communication

and Journalism and Creative Writing to read images and to interpret the meanings which the visual messages are intended to convey.

During the workshop Prof. Jayasankar explained the students the various stages of film production and discussed how ideas and concepts are developed and explored for making documentaries. He engaged the students in practical assignments for writing effective

stories and treatment.

Prof. Javasankar screened documentaries 'From the Margins', 'City's Edge' and 'Cornered City' at the workshop and taught the students how to understand dramatic structures in films

The workshop helped the students to learn the creative process of writing stories and scripts for films and encouraged them to understand visuals with the intended perceptions.


Professor Jayasankar — A Brief Profile

End-Semester Examinations Held

The End-Semester Examinations of all the departments of CUHP started as per schedule on 10th December 2012 and will end on 22nd Dec. 2012 covering a period of 13 days. The examinations are held in two shifts per day. The convenience of the examinees has also been given due consideration so that as far as possible adequate gap between two examinations is available for students

to make necessary preparations. Any issue raised by the students/faculty is given due hearing in a democratic manner.

Each department of the University plans the seating arrangement for the examinations including the allotment of faculty to act as invigilators.

As per the UGC guidelines, all examinations have a combination of 25 multiple choice ques-

tions all of which are compulsory, eight short answer questions of which the students have to attempt five, and five essay or long type questions all of which are compulsory but having internal choice. Guidelines are provided to the respective paper-setters to have a uniform spread of questions from all the units of the course.

UGC sanctions Chair in Tribal Studies in the CUHP

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has accorded in principle sanction to institute a Chair in Tribal Studies in the Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP). While many universities have specialised centres or departments engaged in teaching and research in the area of tribal studies, there has been a need to anchor a body of knowledge around this segment of population. A timely initiative, this will enable the University to make its intellectual contribution towards the understanding of the issues involved through specialised knowledge base, data base, knowledge pathways for addressing the development processes. To take advantage of the opportunity, the University is in the process of developing detailed proposal for submission to the UGC. The Chair sanctioned by the UGC may provide for financial assistance to cover the expenses on the salaries of a Senior Professor, a Postdoctoral Research Associate, 2-3 Junior Research Fellowships and a few technical assistants. The Chair may also be supported with adequate library, research, contingency, travel and seminar grants.

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Committed to Inclusive Access and Excellence in **Higher Education**



Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP) was established under the Central Universities Act 2009 enacted by the Parliament of India. The University became functional from 20th January 2010 with Professor Furgan Qamar assuming the charge as the first and founder Vice Chancellor of the University.

Standing for Inclusive Access and Excellence in Higher Education, it is a multidisciplinary university. The Vision document of the University provides for seventeen different schools with five to six Departments and two to three Centres in each school. Of these eleven Schools and eighteen Departments and two Centres have been made functional.

The University has adopted comprehensive choice based credit system which mandates students to accumulate at least 30 percent credits from departments other than those in which they major. This makes all programmes of studies inter-disciplinary and all students study in an interdisciplinary environment. All programmes of studies are based on semester system and the University follows comprehensive continuous internal assessment and Grading Sys-

The University is to have its headquarter in Dharamshala and two distinct campuses located in Dharamshala and Dehra, both in the picturesque Kangra District of Himachal Pradesh. The land for both the campuses have been identified and allotted to the University and proposal for FCA clearance is at the advanced stages of progress. Following which, the land is likely to be transferred to the University and construction of permanent campuses shall begin.

In the Interim, the university has commenced its academic activities from the Temporary Academic Block (TAB) located at Shahpur in the Kangra District. The Headquarter of the University is located at Camp Office at Dharamshala.
