From March 03, 2011 to March 09, 2011, Professor Harish Narang, a retired English Professor from JNU, New Delhi and an eminent scholar in the field of English literature, was on a visit to the Central University of Himachal Pradesh as a guest faculty to the School of Humanities and Languages. He delivered special lectures to the recently admitted students of Ph. D. (English) and also organized a workshop on 'Academic Writing' which was attended by the students of all the disciplines and departments. On the first day of his visit, he made the students of RD Program understand how to prepare a proposal / concept note for organizing a universitylevel seminar/conference. He also assigned them the task of documenting a concept note on 'Literature, Culture, and Society.' Prof. Narang also distributed an essay on the folk dances in India to all the students present and asked them to summarise it in 200 words of their own.

On the second day, the Prof. Narang delivered a lecture on 'Post-colonialism and Literary Studies in India' to the research students and explained to them how the literary studies in India have not still decolonised themselves as far as the syllabi of the various Indian universities are concerned. On Friday, a workshop was conducted on how to sketch a mindmap on a certain topic asserting its importance in creative as well as formal writing. Prof. Narang showed a mindmap prepared by him to all the students. In the evening session, he asked the students to develop a mind-map on 'globalwarming' as an exercise of the workshop. To develop the teaching aptitude of research scholars, the visiting Professor allotted them the task of evaluating

the workshop assignments of the PG students which they performed skilfully and enthusiastically. Dr. Narang resumed his interaction on Monday. In his interaction with the RD students, he made them learn how to prepare an abstract for a scholarly paper and after a discussion on the topic, he assigned the students an exercise of preparing an abstract of the given research paper. He also delivered a lecture on 'Report Writing' and then made the students prepare a feasibility report on the possibility of holding cricket-world-cup matches at Dharamshala cricket stadium. On 8th March, he provided cues to prepare a synopsis for a research article and also made them acquainted with the general proceedings of a national/international seminar. In the first session of the workshop of the day, he delivered an illuminating lecture on 'plagiarism' in research and in the post -lunch session, he explained how to abstain from the legal and ethical crime of plagiarism.

On the last day of his honourable presence at CUHP, Prof. Narang guided the research students to prepare a synopsis for a PhD thesis. In the workshop, he introduced the scholars to the various ways of acknowledgement in research writings and explained the MLA Style methods of parenthetical as well as bibliographical citations in a scholarly paper. With his best wishes to all the students, he bid good-bye. Prof. Narang's enlightening and scholarly visit to the varsity will surely inspire the CUHP community in their academic ventures.

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Committed to Inclusive Access and Excellence in Higher Education

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Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP) was established under the Central Universities Act 2009 enacted by the Parliament of India. The University became functional from 20th January 2010 with Professor Furqan Qamar assuming the charge as the first and founder Vice Chancellor of the University

Standing for Inclusive Access and Excellence in Higher Education, it is a multidisciplinary university. The Vision document of the University provides for seventeen different schools with five to six Departments and two to three Centres in each school. Of these eleven Schools and eighteen Departments and two Centres have been made functional

The University has adopted comprehensive choice based credit system which mandates students to accumulate at least 30 percent credits from departments other than those in which they major. This makes all programmes of studies inter-disciplinary and all students study in an interdisciplinary environment. All programmes of studies are based on semester system and the University follows comprehensive continuous internal assessment and Grading System

The University is to have its headquarter in Dharamshala and two distinct campuses located in Dharamshala and Dehra, both in the picturesque Kangra District of Himachal Pradesh. The land for both the campuses have been identified and allotted to the University and proposal for FCA clearance is at the advanced stages of progress. Following which, the land is likely to be transferred to the University and construction of permanent campuses shall begin.

In the Interim, the university has commenced its academic activities from the Temporary Academic Block (TAB) located at Shahpur in the Kangra District. The Headquarter of the University is located at Camp Office at Dharamshala.

First Interaction of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor with RD students

Prof. Furgan Qamar, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor met for the first time with the first batch of the research scholars of the varsity on 11th March, 2011. The interaction took place in the Conference Hall and was also attended by other senior administratorscum-academicians of the university. A brief introduction by each student was followed by a lively session of talks focusing on various issues faced by larger academic scenario as well as by new entrants. Prof Qamar greeted the students and drew their attention to the opportunities and responsibilities faced by them in higher education. He told that there is a deficiency of teachers (approx. 0.2 million) in higher educational institutes across the country, and despite this fact there are people who remain unemployed even when they possess requisite qualifications. The reason behind such unemployment is lack of quality in the realm of higher education. This gap between requirement and availability can only be filled by quality higher education and research. Prof Qamar told the students that it is this quality of education and research that CUHP is going to impart and for that RD students must work hard. He also accepted the fact that initially, infrastructure is not as per requirements but these impediments are temporary and will be surmounted as soon as possible. Later the students asked questions regarding hostel and library facilities, faculty recruitment, etc. which were answered by him. Finally, Prof. Qamar wished the students well and asked them to give their best for their career as well as the varsity. Students, in turn, thanked the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor and other delegates for sharing their precious time and valuable inputs.
